

STANDING ORDERS AND STANDING RESOLUTIONS STATUTE 1968

BE IT ENACTED by the Bishop, Clergy and Laity of the Diocese of Auckland in Synod assembled:

1. The short title of this statute shall be **“STANDING ORDERS AND STANDING RESOLUTIONS STATUTE 1968”**.
2. The Standing Orders which shall from time to time be made by any Synod for the ordering of its own proceedings shall continue in force until the same or any succeeding Synod shall make other regulations in lieu thereof.
3. At the close of each annual Session of Synod the resolutions passed thereat shall stand referred to the Legal Business Committee, which shall prepare and present to the next annual Session of Synod a report and schedule of all the resolutions which, in its opinion, should be maintained in force.
4. The said report and schedule shall be circulated with other matter sent to members before the Session. It shall be the duty of the President of the Synod to move at some time during the annual Session that the report and schedule be considered by the Synod in Committee, and then presented to the Synod for adoption.
5. Every resolution so approved shall be styled a Standing Resolution and, together with Standing Resolutions previously adopted, shall be printed in the proceedings of the Synod under the heading “Standing Resolutions of the Synod”.
6. No annulment or amendment of a Standing Resolution shall be made unless the motion for the same shall have been considered by the Committee of the whole Synod before it is submitted to the vote of the Synod.
7. It shall be competent for the Legal Business Committee to review resolutions passed at previous Sessions of the Synod with a view to the preparation of a schedule of such resolutions as should be included among the Standing Resolutions.
8. From and after the 1st day of January 1968, any resolution not included in the Standing Resolutions of the Synod shall remain in force until the adoption of the report and schedule required by clause 3 hereof at the meeting of the next ensuing annual Session of the Synod.
9. Nothing in this statute shall affect the force, effect or validity of any resolution passed prior to the 1st day of January 1968.
