**Re.: Update re. Synod 2016 – Motion 3: Homelessness**

At the 2016 Synod, we declared our intention to work with community based organisations in addressing the homelessness crisis, when Synod agreed the following motion:

*“THAT this Synod calls for the following courses of action:*

- 1. That Ministry Units liaise closely and effectively with other community based organisations in efforts to house the homeless;*
- 2. That the homelessness crisis be on the agenda for each clergy cluster meeting until Diocesan Synod 2017;*
- 3. That each Ministry Unit is encouraged to send a team to volunteer at the Auckland City Mission distribution centre or community food bank at least twice a year.”*

You are encouraged to ask your governing body to talk about homelessness and consider what your Ministry Unit could do. Youth Synod representative Michael Kennerley has provided the following information to assist your Ministry Unit in carrying out these actions.

## Homelessness – information pack

### Homelessness

At least 1 in 100 New Zealanders are homeless. The definition of homelessness is *“A living situation where people with no other options to acquire safe and secure housing are: without shelter, in temporary accommodation, sharing accommodation with a household, or living in uninhabitable housing.”* Homelessness includes rough sleepers and people living in cars, garages, boarding houses, motels, camping grounds, and the majority who live with extended friends and family in overcrowded houses.

### Auckland City Mission

Over 80% of Auckland City Mission’s services are funded by donations. A good way of raising money is by fundraising around an event. Contact Auckland City Mission and they’re happy to speak at the event or help promote it.

Auckland City Mission gave out almost 14,000 food parcels last year, and there is a major demand on donations. The core items that are put in each food parcel are shown in the following link: [www.aucklandcitymission.org.nz/fundraising/food-parcels](http://www.aucklandcitymission.org.nz/fundraising/food-parcels).

Auckland City Mission accepts donations of high quality used household items, clothing and bedding. Check out the Auckland City Mission website for information on particular items that they are in need of. Rough sleepers in particular need core items such as:

- Toiletries (the same items you’d typically get at a motel)
- New underwear
- Good shoes (especially large shoes)
- Sleeping bags, blankets, jackets and warm clothes for the winter.

Auckland City Mission needs groups of volunteers all-year round to help at the Grafton Distribution Centre. This typically involves packing/sorting food parcels or sorting donated clothing and household items. About 75 individual volunteers work regularly at the Mission and volunteers are needed to help in community activities, assisting in the op-shops, transporting clients, assisting with administration and helping with general maintenance.

There is an overwhelming demand on services at Christmas, and about 3,000 food parcels are given out over this period. This time needs many more volunteers and donations, as well as unwrapped Christmas presents for children under 16.

Auckland City Mission would like to thank all those who support their services through donations, volunteering, or whatever means people have contributed.

## Other organisations

There are many groups across the Auckland Diocese that work alongside the homeless. Several of the other large groups include:

- The Salvation Army (Auckland wide)
- VisionWest Community Trust (Glen Eden)
- Monte Cecilia Housing Trust (Mangere)
- De Paul House (Northcote).

Your personal circumstances and location affect how you can most effectively combat homelessness. The simplest response is to check out your local community, as most areas have several groups working directly with homeless people or in social services.

The following pages contain details of some of the organisations and food banks within the Diocese region, to provide a starting directory for organisations in your area. These lists are not comprehensive and there may be other groups within your community that your Ministry Unit can liaise with.
