MISSION & MINISTRY PLAN

As a church, our vision has been to encounter God in us, through us and beyond us.

During the past year, the Vestry have worked through the diocesan 'Healthy Church Consultation' process to identify our goals and plans under the following four areas:

Knowing God

As a church, we seek to deepen our relationship with Him through worship, our prayer life and listening. We enable this by providing opportunities to be present to the presence of God in worship, for prayer at the end of each service, reflection, sharing and support through home groups and valuing learning from excellent preaching (which is a shared role).







Shaping Community

One of our strengths is our church community which shows acceptance and welcome to all. We do this through hospitality, social activities, prayer ministry and pastoral care. We are looking at ways to build on this through childfriendly services, and using multiple languages in our services e.g. Te Reo Maori, Tongan and Chinese.

Living Beyond Ourselves

Our focus has been on developing and implementing opportunities to connect with our local community. We plan to achieve this further by; offering courses, using signage in the town centre, formalising our prison ministry policies and publicising this ministry to our parish.

HISTORY

Settled on top of a hill, between the Tāmaki River and Panmure Basin. The site of the current church lay on the important water trade route between the Waitematā and Manukau harbours, and provided safe anchorage for boats plying the East Coast of the North Island. The soil was generally fertile resulting in a large Maori population from Ngāti Pāoa.

In 1821 Hone Heke with 2000 warriors and 1000 muskets attacked two pā called Mauinaina and Mokoia because of an ancient grievance in the near vicinity of the current church. He virtually wiped out Mauinaina, except for the chiefs children, many from Mokoia escaped, but the pā itself was destroyed with any who remained.

The first Anglican church was built in 1852 after Irish Fencibles (retired soldiers) were stationed nearby to protect peace. The current church was completed in 1866 and opened by Bishop Selwyn. Initially it was linked to the Howick Parish, then to Otāhuhu.

The first full time vicar was the Rev Gould who officiated at both and was also responsible for the Kaipara district and Waiheke Island. He had 16 children and retired after 42 years at the age of 76 in 1903.




FACILITIES

The church has a capacity of 110 people (at a squeeze!)

The hall can sit 150 as an area for services/events with space for an altar, lectern and band. For seated dinners we can accommodate 100 people. There is an office and newly renovated kitchen.

Our vicarage is a comfortable family home, located on a private section next to the church, it offers:

- 4 bedrooms plus a small study
- 2 bathrooms and a separate toilet
- Floor area is 232m².
- Land area is 1621m2

International Hearts


A weekly evening meeting with a meal where newcomers to NZ can explore kiwi life and faith with us.

Prayer walking

Weekly walking and prayer through our neighbourhood with others zooming in to participate without physically being there (if required under Covid 19 regulations).

Prison ministry

A small group of us are mentoring long term prisoners through letter writing and phone calls to provide social contact for some who have no visitors.







Evening worship service

To be monthly. This was to start in August 2021 but has been postponed due to the covid 19 restrictions.

'Posh Club'

These events ran before Covid, with 3 afternoon teas a year for the elderly and lonely in our community - usually had a theme (1920s, 60s etc), and a live band playing songs from the time.
